JOB PURPOSE

Deliver a range of services for young people aged 8-19 years old in Gospel Oak and its surrounding areas in the London Borough of Camden to help them to reach their full potential.

- Develop and maintain positive relationships with all young people
- Meet young people's individual needs and effectively manage challenging behaviour

- Contribute to the planning and development of youth projects and to involve young people in decision making

- Undertake relevant administrative duties including monitoring and evaluation of the service and recording outcomes

 which contains a gym, music studio, computer room and large indoor multi-use sports hall.
